FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

As I think about the Foundation and our purpose, I realize that the purpose is continually evolving. Although our mission is to enrich and enhance education for our students, the specific need often changes. With tightened school budgets and demands for varied education becoming greater, we take a moment to review the many contributions we have. We are blessed to have an amazing group of Board of Directors that not only puts the time in, but listens and does the research to determine how we can best help the Winona Area Public Schools and its students. By reflecting on the work of the Foundation's past year, we continue to expand educational opportunities for our students.

We started the 2018-2019 school year by rolling out the "World Market" event dollars to administration and staff. Dollars were distributed proportionately to schools and departments on a per student basis. This past school year, we were proud to donate \$58,000 to WAPS to use for educational enhancements.

Next, two grant awards were provided to staff who donated through payroll deduction. The grant awards, to be used for educational enrichment, were given this past year to Dwayne Voegeli and Jon Feldhake. They used their grants for the WSHS Link Crew program which is a peer mentorship program that connects upperclassmen Link Leaders with every freshman in the high school.

The annual \$5000 Dare to Dream grant flooded the Foundation with wonderful innovative ideas to develop education for our students. This year's winning grant was written by Jen Snook for Class Virtual Reality. Look for more information on this grant award later in this newsletter.

This winter, a diligent industrious committee worked countless hours to present the event, A Night to Shine, to our guests. For the second year in a row, one of the worst blizzards of the winter would not keep our donors from supporting education for the Winona Area Public Schools. The sold-out event raised \$53,000 for Academics, Arts, Athletics and Activities. The proceeds from the event were distributed to our schools at the beginning of the 2019-2020 school year.

In the spring, students, sometimes for the first time, were exposed to the art of poetry through the annual Haake Poetry Prize Competition. Dr. Paul Haake created a fund at the Foundation for WAPS with a generous donation which allowed us to provide the opportunity for this poetry contest.

Scholarship funds continued to grow this year as we were able to provide 29 scholarships at the WSHS Awards Ceremony to students progressing on with further education.

This fall, the Foundation is also welcoming the new superintendent of schools, Annette Freiheit, to the Winona Area Public Schools and Foundation Board of Directors. Annette comes to Winona with a rich background as a former teacher, principal, superintendent of schools and WSU graduate. We look forward to partnering with Annette to find the best ways to enrich education for our students.

As educational trends change and continue to grow, the Foundation for WAPS wants to ensure that the students of the Winona Area Public Schools are either prepared for the work force or small and large universities alike. We are proud to play a role and also know that the abundant support from donors, alumni, staff, community and businesses affords us the opportunity to provide for our schools. We could not do it without this great support. Thank you!! We look forward to additionally playing a role in another great school year.

WAPS ALUMNA, GAYLE B. GOETZMAN, GIVES BACK TO THE FOUNDATION!



Gayle Goetzman loved school. She started school at W-K when she was five and attended there through the 9th grade. She talked about having good educators, good principals and a teacher, Miss Pear, who helped Gayle to acquire a passion for reading. Gayle Goetzman taught for thirty-six years. Thirty-Five of those years were at WAPS, with twenty-seven years at W-K. Often, people leave a legacy when they have passed. Gayle chose to leave part of her legacy to the Foundation for Winona Area Public Schools in a form of a scholarship. When asked why she chose to leave her gift at this time, she stated, "I want to make sure my wishes are carried out and I want to help students. I want to help carry out the gift of education to others and make a difference." She continued to say, "I want to live passion with a purpose." Gayle started a \$3000 annual scholarship at the Foundation for a student who will be pursuing post-secondary education; and hopes that they have attended W-K during part of their educational years. FOUNDATION FOR WAPS 2018 DARE TO DREAM WINNER!

Jen Snook, WMS Technology Integration Specialist, is awarded the Foundation for Winona Area Public Schools 2018/2019 \$5000 Dare to Dream grant winner. Jen writes, "The Winona Area Public Schools is moving more and more in a direction of learning through technology to support communication, collaboration, creativity and problem solving. Teachers and students alike seek out authentic experiences and find it is more important than ever to discover new and engaging ways to learn and teach."

Jen's dream is to incorporate virtual and augmented reality into education and training in the classroom to achieve this goal. Jen proposed using the ground-breaking technology of Class VR that immerses students into content in a way that cannot be accomplished in two-dimensional space of paper or a computer screen. The library includes over 700 curriculum-aligned resources which provides content on topics, such as, historical times, habitats and nature, cities and structures, conflicts and disasters, physical features, science and technology, and arts and culture. Beyond the resources included in the set, teachers can create their own virtual reality experiences using 360 degree photos and videos. In addition to the physical components of the set, ClassVR includes online help and on-site technical support.

Virtual reality and augmented reality build on current effective practices of immersing students in cultural, scientific, artistic, and mathematical thinking, in order to experience that content from within and to help understand it to a deeper degree. As an example, through the use of virtual reality, students can "walk-around" inside an animal cell and look around to identify parts of the cell and witness processes up close. They can also "walk along" the Great Wall of China and view the landscape from atop the structure. With augmented reality, students might rotate a 3-dimensional human heart in their personal space as if they have access to the actual object.

Snook sees the ClassVR system as a multi-media approach which enhances what students are seeing in books or Google media. She explains that looking at information in a 3D virtual reality mode helps the students to engage in new and meaningful ways. It is Snook's hope that this is just the next step toward encouraging lasting learning,
