FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

As we navigated the second school year with COVID-19, it became much more of a norm. We would never have thought we would have been in year two of the pandemic, but we felt confident that as needs changed, we adapted. As a Foundation and as a school district, our communication has evolved. We watched the community and school report on graph charts that helped us to understand the COVID-19 case numbers. We continued to wear masks throughout the buildings for the safety of all and it too became the norm. We were successful at keeping the majority of our students in the classroom learning but provided online learning for those students who needed it or felt more comfortable with it.

The Foundation took queues from the Winona Area Public School's Administration on how we could best serve our students. Although some normalcy was back in place, we still had needs stemming from the pandemic and we were happy to support.

The third time was finally the charm as we were able to hold our fundraising event after two previous cancellations. The October 9th, 2021 **Nosh in Nashville** event welcomed those attending with a background vibe of country music which became the common thread connecting the life and soul of our guests who were all too happy to dust off their boots and fancy a shiny buckle or plaid shirt.

Our annual \$5000 **Dare to Dream** grant offering had more applications than ever. The grant awarded this year went to *The Outdoor Classroom*, written by Sarah Hedin and Amber Mlynczak, designed to fund an outdoor educational setting fitting for the current times at WMS.

We awarded 24 scholarships this past year to students who plan to continue their higher education and offered two new \$5000 scholarships to eager applicants. Funds held at the Foundation are set up to provide scholarships in memory and honor of people, as well as, multiple organizations who want to give back to students.

Grants are an integral offering from our organization. *We provided 47 grants to our schools to help* enhance and enrich education for our students by providing opportunities that students may not have had with normal school budgets.

The annual Haake Poetry Prize Competition awarded 10 prizes to students blindly selected by an esteem panel of judges. After two previous years of meeting via ZOOM, the judges were happy to meet this year in person to determine which WMS and WSHS poetry authors would capture the prize awards.

As the newsletter comes to print, we find a more normal time for all of us. We are fortunate to have community and business supporters who value public education. We are so appreciative we could continue to serve and we could not provide the assistance we do without you and the continued support of donations we receive. *Thank you!!*

WSHS Winhawk Marching Band trip to Florida

As almost a rite of passage, 94 Winhawk students had the opportunity to represent WSHS as well as the entire Winona community on a truly international stage by taking the WSHS Winhawk Marching Band trip to Florida. The trip offered every band student to be an ambassador for WSHS during their junior or senior year. Students were part of a major public performance and experienced ethnic and cultural backgrounds.



Minneapolis Institute of Art Field Trip

AP World History students visited the Minneapolis Institute of Art through a Foundation sponsored field trip. Students viewed artwork from different regions and time-periods including Islamic art from the 900's, various Chinese dynasties and period rooms from the 1600's around the world. The Minneapolis Institute of Art's exhibits followed world history and the connections made between what the students saw and the content in class.



Winona Senior High Orchestra Trip to New York

The WSHS Orchestra traveled to New York City to experience cultural learning, be part of the musical epicenter in the U.S., hear a live symphony at the New York Philharmonic, see the Metropolitan Museum of Art, attend the Broadway show, Hamilton, and see the many historical sites and views of New York City. This cultural and historical educational experience was beyond epoch.



Minnesota Marine Art Museum

Sixty WSHS students, in the class Introduction to Art, got the experience of visiting an art museum and receiving a guided tour from a Docent who taught the students more about professional art. The museum, located on the bank of the Mississippi River in Winona has collections themed around oceans, the sea, rivers, and lakes.
